RACE TO THE KING 2020 – PUBLIC

1 REGISTRATION

- 1.1 The Race to the King (“Event”) consists of an event on foot (of up to two stages) along the South Downs Way national trail to Winchester Cathedral scheduled to take place on 20th and 21st June 2020 and is organised by Threshold Sports Ltd (“Threshold”) and shall be referred to as the “Race to the King” or such other title as Threshold may advise.
- 1.2 Only persons aged 16 years or above as at 20th June 2020 may register for the Event.
- 1.3 Applicants must complete and submit the online registration form (“Online Registration Form”) which can be found at www.racetotheking.com (the “Event Website”), and pay the Entry Fee (the “Entry Fee”) and the booking fee between £3.40 - £4.60 per place (the “Booking Fee”).
- 1.4 All successful applicants (hereinafter referred to as “Participants”) will be notified by way of an email confirmation that they have been allocated a place to take part in the Event (“Online Confirmation”).
- 1.5 Places in the Event are strictly limited and therefore applications are subject to availability. Subject to Clauses 1.2 to 1.4 (inclusive) above, Threshold will consider applications on a first come, first served basis by eligible Participants (which Threshold shall determine in its absolute discretion) and otherwise in accordance with these Rules and Regulations (“Rules and Regulations”).
- 1.6 The relevant date for registrations shall be the date the Participant receives the Online Confirmation. Threshold is not responsible for technical, hardware or software failures of any kind, lost or unavailable network connections, or failed, incomplete, garbled or delayed computer/Internet transmissions or other errors or malfunctions of any kind which may prevent receipt by Threshold of an Online Registration Form or receipt by an applicant of an Online Confirmation. For the avoidance of doubt, if, for any reason whatsoever, an applicant does not receive an Online Confirmation, said applicant shall not be considered to be a Participant and Threshold shall not be responsible for the applicant’s failed application.
- 1.7 All Online Registration Forms must be received by Threshold on or before midnight on Sunday 14th June 2020 (“Entry Deadline”). Any Online Registration received by Threshold after the Entry Deadline will not be accepted. This deadline is subject to change if the Event entries are full prior to the above date, and in accordance with Clause 1.5. Threshold reserves the right to close the Online Registration Form at any point.

All prices are inclusive of VAT.

- 2.1 Subject to the other provisions of Section 1, submission of the Online Registration Form, payment of the Entry Fee and the Booking Fee, and receipt of the Online Confirmation shall (together) entitle the Participant to participate in the Event.
- 2.2 The Event is personal to the Participant accepting these Rules and Regulations, and the Participant undertakes and agrees (i) only to participate in the Event wearing the number assigned to his/her registration, (ii) not to authorise or permit any third party to use his/her Participant number for the Event and (iii) not to sell, transfer or give any other person the right to participate in the Event and/or use the Participant's number, with the exception of compliance with Clause 2.2.
- 2.3 If at any time it is discovered that any Participant should have been ineligible to participate in the Event or if participation in the Event should have been refused for any reason whatsoever, Threshold reserves the right to disqualify such Participant from/refuse such Participant entry to the Event. Further, Threshold reserves the right to reject at any time any Online Registration Form which it believes to be fraudulent, or to disqualify at any time any Participant it believes not to have fully complied with these Rules and Regulations from participating in the Event, or in any future Threshold events. Threshold shall not be liable in any way to such Participant as a result of any such disqualification or refusal. It is the Participant's responsibility to ensure full compliance with these Rules and Regulations.
- 2.4 If any provision in these Rules and Regulations, whether in full or in part, is held to be invalid or unenforceable, all other remaining provisions (in full or in part) shall continue to be valid and enforceable.
- 2.5 These Rules and Regulations (and any documents referred to herein) constitute the entire agreement and understanding of the parties and supersede any previous agreement between the parties relating to the Event. Nothing in these conditions shall constitute or be deemed to constitute a partnership between the parties. These Rules and Regulations shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of England and Wales and any dispute arising hereunder shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.

3 CANCELLATION OPTIONS

- 3.1 Any Participant intending to cancel their place in the Event shall inform Threshold as soon as reasonably practicable ("Cancellation Notification").
 - 3.1.1 Threshold operates a seven (7) day cooling off period. Accordingly, the Participant is entitled to cancel his/her Entry to participate, provided Threshold receives written notice of cancellation within seven (7) days of payment of the Entry Fee. During this 7-day period, the Participant is able to cancel his/her entry and receive a full refund of the Entry Fee by emailing info@racetotheking.com. The notice must be received before the end of the seven (7) day cooling off period. The Booking Fee is non-refundable.
 - 3.1.2 Thereafter, the Entry Fee is non-refundable under any circumstances.
 - 3.1.3 If the Participant is a charity entry, any donations raised will not be refunded.
- 3.2 PARTICIPANT TRANSFER
 - 3.2.1 A Participant can transfer their entry to another individual ("Participant Transfer") if notice is given to the Event Organisers. Participants who transfer their Entry can be eligible for a full refund of all Fees paid (minus the Booking Fee and the Administration Fee) subject to Clauses 3.2.1 - 3.2.7.
 - 3.2.2 Notice of a Participant Transfer must be done via the Participant's ['MyEvents'](#) Portal. The ['MyEvents'](#) Portal is an *Active Networks* system, which allows the Participant to manage his/her registration details for the Event.

- Click Transfer registration to another athlete
- Enter recipient email address in email address field
- Enter recipient email address in Confirm email address field and click Submit
- Confirmation email sent to Outgoing Participant and new Participant to verify that the transfer process has been initiated.

3.2.3 Participant Transfers can only take place if the new Participant wishes to take the same Race to the King package

3.2.4 The most current Entry Fee and Booking Fee is applied at checkout when the new Participant accepts the transfer by clicking the link within the confirmation email detailed in 3.2.2. This Entry Fee could be higher than that for the original Participant

3.2.5 The original Entry Fee is not refunded until the new Participant accepts and completes the transfer process.

3.2.6 Refunds are processed within 5-7 business days.

3.2.7 The Administration Fee will be deducted automatically from the refund as follows:

- Before 23:59, 15th May 2020: £25
- Before 23:59, 14th June 2020: £30

3.3 PARTICIPANT DEFERRAL

3.3.1 A Participant is permitted to defer their entry to the following year (2021 Event) if notice is given to the Event Organisers.

3.3.2 The Participant must pay the administration fee before the deferral can be confirmed. This is payable via the 'Additional Purchases' section of the MyEvents portal.

3.3.3 The deadlines and associated Administration fee for this are:

- Before 23:59, 15th May 2020: £25
- Before 23:59, 14th June 2020: £30

3.3.4 Once the Administration fee has been processed, within 5 working days, the Event Organisers will cancel the Participant registration for 2020. The Event Organisers will not refund the Entry Fee, but will then send the Participant a free of charge web link to sign up to the Event the following year. The Participant will not need to pay again for the following year.

3.3.5 If the Participant wishes to change their package, it is then the responsibility of the Participant to complete the following the steps outlined in Clause 3.4 once they have completed their registration for 2021

3.3.6 The Participant understands that once a deferral has been processed, the Administration Fee is non-refundable under any circumstances.

3.3.7 A participant can only defer their entry once. A deferral will not be permitted if the Participant has already deferred previously.

3.4 EVENT TRANSFER

3.4.1 A participant can transfer their entry to another ultramarathon in the Threshold Trail Series if notice is given to the Event Organisers.

3.4.2 Notice of an event transfer must be done via the Participant's "[MyEvents](#)" Portal.

- Click Transfer to another event
- Select the event and category and complete the form

3.4.3 The deadlines and associated Administration Fees for this are:

- HEINEKEN Race to the Castle 2002: 23:59, Sun 31st May, £25
- Dixons Carphone Race to the Stones 2020: 23:59, 14th June, £25
- Race to the Tower 2020: 23:59, 14th June , £25

3.4.4 Participants who have already signed up to a Trail Series event and would like to transfer their place to HEINEKEN Race to the Castle, can do so for 1 month from the HEINEKEN Race to the Castle launch date, until 12pm 4th November 2019 free of charge. After this time the £25 Event Transfer fee will apply. Please note that those transferring to a higher priced package are required to pay the increase in fee and those transferring to a lower priced package will not receive a refund for the difference in price.

3.5 PARTICIPANT CHANGE OF PACKAGE

3.5.1 A Participant can change their package if notice is given to the Event Organisers.

3.5.2 Notice of a participant package change must be done via the Participant's "[MyEvents](#)" Portal.

- Click Transfer to another category
- Select the new category complete the form

3.5.3 No changes to a Participants package can be accepted after 23:59 14th June 2020

3.5.4 If the Participant is transferring to a package with a decrease in Entry Fee, the Participant will not be refunded the difference in these packages.

3.5.5 If the Participant is transferring to a package with an increase in Entry Fee, the difference plus any incremental Booking Fees for making the change must be paid before the Participant can complete the change.

3.5.6 If a participant is transferring to a charity package, please call the event hotline as a refund of the difference will be given.

3.5.7 The most current Entry Fee and Booking Fee is applied at checkout.

4 THE RACE TO THE KING

4.1 Subject to Clause 4.8 below, the Event will be held on 20th and 21st June 2020.

4.2 The Event is a double marathon non-stop or two day endurance event on foot travelling the South Downs Way national trail to Winchester Cathedral, totalling approx 52 miles ("Event Distance"). Participants are able to enter to following packages:

- “Non-stop” – a double marathon non-stop, between 20-21 June 2020
 - “Weekender” – a double marathon over two days, between 20-21 June 2020, with camping overnight at the basecamp
 - “Weekender excluding camping” – a double marathon over two days, between 20-21 June 2020, without overnight camping provision
 -
 - “Day 1/ Day 2 including camping” – a marathon, either on 20th June or 21st June 2020, with camping overnight at basecamp
 - “Day 1/ Day 2 only” – a marathon, either on 20th or 21st June 2020, without overnight camping provision.
- 4.3 Participants are able to take part in the Event as part of a team. Participants must enter a team name on their Online Registration Form. Participants are encouraged to complete the route in groups for reasons of safety, although this is not compulsory.
- 4.4 Prizes will be awarded to individuals taking part in the “Non-stop”, “Weekender packages (incl. or excl. camping)”, “Day 1 only” and the “Day 2 only” packages who record the fastest time for the Event Distance within their package type in the following categories: Fastest Male and Fastest Female.
- 4.5 Prizes will be awarded for “Weekender” participants and “Day 2” participants based on ‘chip time’.
- 4.5.1 “Chip time” uses timing technology to record the time it takes for the Participant to complete the course starting from the point that the Participant crosses the timing mats at the Start line to crossing the timing mats at the Finish line.
- 4.6 Prizes will be awarded for “Non-stop” and “Day 1” participants based on ‘gun time’.
- 4.6.1 “Gun time” refers to the time it takes a Participant to complete the course, from the starting gun at the beginning of the race to the point the Participant crosses the Finish line.
- 4.6.2 Please note, those competing for a prize in the “Non-stop”, must set off in the first wave group (category A).
- 4.7 Prizes will also be awarded to the team that records a time for the Event Distance taking part in the “Non-stop” package, whereby at least 3 (three) team members have crossed the finish line. The recorded time is when the third team member crosses the finish line.
- 4.8 Threshold reserves the right to change the time, date, route and/or format of the Event and to cancel the Event, in whole or in part, without notice or liability to the Participant. Threshold shall inform the Participant by email of any such change or cancellation.
- 4.9 Threshold reserves the right to remove any Participant from the Event, either during or before it, due to ill health, or any other reason (at Threshold’s discretion) that may render the Participant unfit to safely complete the Event. The Participant confirms that he/she will not take part in the Event if he/she is suffering from any contagious illness (in particular diarrhoea or vomiting symptoms) and confirms that he/she will report any illness during the Event, to the Event medical team immediately.
- 4.10 Without prejudice to Threshold’s right to remove any Participant from the Event due to ill health pursuant to Clause 4.9 above, the Participant acknowledges and agrees that:
- 4.10.1 If the Participant is taking part in the “Weekender” or “Weekender excl. camping” package and becomes ill with a non-infectious illness (as determined by the Event medical team) during Day 1 (Saturday 20th June 2020) but wishes to then join Day 2 (Sunday 21st June 2020) Threshold will, where reasonably practicable and subject to the advice of the Event medical team, transfer the Participant to the overnight base camp. Where such transfer is not reasonably practicable (or where

the Event medical team advise against the Participant's continued involvement in the Event), the Participant shall be removed from the Event.

- 4.10.2 If, however, the Participant becomes ill with an infectious illness (as determined by the Event medical team), the Participant shall be removed from the Event.
- 4.11 A Participant may be disqualified ("Disqualification") from the Event by Threshold if:
- 4.11.1 the Participant arrives at the pit stop after the designated pit stop cut off time ("Pit Stop Cut Off Time"). The Participant will be responsible for his/her repatriation according to Clause 4.12; Pit Stop Cut Off Times will be communicated to the Participants via e-mail a minimum of two weeks in advance of the Event;
- 4.11.2 the Participant is found asleep along the route, or at a pit stop, by a member of Event staff. The Participant will be responsible for his/ her repatriation according to Clause 4.12;
- 4.12 In the event of a Participant having to leave the Event because of injury, illness, voluntary withdrawal or Disqualification, the Participant will be responsible for all repatriation travel costs and related incurred travel arrangements. This includes repatriation from the overnight basecamp or pit stops to the finish location as a result of voluntary withdrawal or Disqualification. Threshold will not be responsible for transporting the Participant or any belongings of the Participants, including, but not limited to, their bag.
- 4.13 Threshold will endeavour to provide every Participant with a completion time but is not responsible for any electronic timing anomalies.
- 4.14 No drugs, illegal substances, performance enhancing substances or intoxicants of any kind are permitted to be used by any Participant either before or during participation in the Event. Threshold reserves the right to refuse attendance at, or participation in, the Event by any persons found to have consumed or to have in their possession any drugs, illegal substances, performance enhancing substances or intoxicants of any kind.
- 4.15 Threshold reserves the exclusive right and license throughout the world (and Participant hereby grants Threshold such exclusive right and licence) to interview and/or photograph and/or film the Participant at the Event (and before and after the Event as Threshold may reasonably require) and to the unlimited, worldwide, sub-licensable right to record, film, reproduce and use in all current and future media (including without limitation, print, audio, visual, audio-visual, virtual media, the Internet, mobile telephony and so-called "3-G" technologies, CD-ROM or DVDs) the Participant's name, likeness and image or facsimile image, signature, voice, video and film portrayals and other means of identification of the Participant, and any biographical or other information or data related to the Participant (including times and results), in connection with the production, advertisement, marketing, promotion or sale of Event sponsor products and/or the promotion, marketing or advertisement of Threshold or any Event sponsor or partner.
- 4.16 As a continuing condition of entry each Participant shall ensure that, for the duration of the Event:
- 4.16.1 the Participant understands that the event involves sustained physical exercise in a remote area, and may involve walking or running at night;
- 4.16.2 the Participant carries a charged mobile phone with appropriate credit;
- 4.16.3 the Participant accepts that they are responsible for their own safety during the Event, in particular during any night sections if applicable to their Event package;
- 4.16.4 the Participant must be competent in navigating from a map of the route provided by Threshold Sports. The route will be signposted, however, he/she remains responsible for navigating themselves from the start to the finish, in particular during any night sections if applicable to their Event package;
- 4.16.5 the Participant agrees that they are responsible for their own fitness to take part in the Event, and will consult a doctor prior to the Event if necessary;

- 4.16.6 the Participant does not start earlier than the official start time on each day of the Event. Failure to comply with this rule will result in disqualification;
- 4.16.7 if taking part in the “Non-stop” package the Participant completes the route between the hours of 7.30am on Saturday 20th June 2020 and 8pm on Sunday 21st June 2020. However, Threshold reserves the right to alter the route start and finish times in the event of mitigating circumstances e.g. inclement weather conditions;
- 4.16.8 if taking part in “Weekender”, “Weekender excl. camping”, “Day 1 only”, “Day 2 only”, “Day 1 incl. camping” or “Day 2 incl. camping” packages the Participant completes the route between the hours of 7.30am and 10.00pm on Saturday 20th June 2020 and 6.00am and 8.00pm on Sunday 21st June, however, Threshold reserves the right to alter the route start and finish times each day in the event of mitigating circumstances e.g. inclement weather conditions;
- 4.16.9 the Participant acknowledges that it is their responsibility to ensure that they have been correctly checked-in at each checkpoint along the route;
- 4.16.10 the Participant acknowledges the recommended kit list of the Event, in accordance with their Event package, as communicated by email prior to the Event by Threshold Sports;
- 4.16.11 the Participant acknowledges that it is compulsory to carry a head torch if participating throughout the night in the dark;
- 4.16.12 the Participant understands that if they wish to withdraw from the Event, they must report to the nearest pit stop or contact Event Control;
- 4.16.13 the Participant understands that they may not be transported by vehicle along any portion of the trail or between any points on it, unless they have formally withdrawn from the Event;
- 4.16.14 due to the outdoor nature and endurance aspect of the Event, the Participant maintains personal hygiene at all times, and adheres to all hygiene advice provided by Threshold;
- 4.16.15 the Participant displays the official event numbers provided at registration in the manner indicated during the Event;
- 4.16.16 the Participant follows the Event route signage at all times, and does not deviate from the official signed route of the Event;
- 4.16.17 the Participant abides by all Event Rules and Regulations;
- 4.16.18 the Participant complies with the Countryside Code at all times;
- 4.16.19 the Participant is responsible for the collection and appropriate disposal of his/her litter along the entirety of the route, at the pit stops, and at the overnight base camp;
- 4.16.20 the Participant understands that there is no permittance of a formal support crew for any Participant along the route, as this could endanger the safety of Participants or other Event staff; and
- 4.16.21 the Participant obeys traffic officers and authorised marshals at all times; failure to do so will result in disqualification.

5 PARTICIPANT’S WARRANTIES AND UNDERTAKINGS

- 5.1 The Participant acknowledges that participation in the Event is not possible without validly entering into this agreement on these Rules and Regulations and agrees to be bound by these Rules and Regulations.
- 5.2 The Participant agrees at all times during the Event to abide by the reasonable instructions and guidelines of Threshold’s staff, nominated representatives, and contractors and to behave appropriately at all times on the

route and in the overnight basecamp. Participants acknowledge and agree that Threshold will organise and run the Event and will have sole authority and be the final arbiter on all decisions relating to the following aspects of the Event: health and safety, logistical operations, participation, organisation and Rules and Regulations.

- 5.3 The Participant understands the endurance demands of the Event and commits to preparing to take part in the Event by:
- 5.3.1 complying with the Event training advice as issued by Threshold (or comparable training advice);
 - 5.3.2 completing a medical and dietary form as provided by Threshold prior to the Event;
 - 5.3.3 providing emergency medical contact details of someone who is not also participating in the Event;
 - 5.3.4 confirming that he/she has appropriate liability and equipment insurance in place in order to participate in the Event and acknowledges that he/she has no claim against Threshold in relation to the provision of such insurance.
- 5.4 The Participant acknowledges that participation in the Event involves inherent risks of accidents and injury.
- 5.5 The Participant acknowledges that he/she is personally responsible for his/her own belongings during the Event, and that he/she must collect any personal lost items from lost property before he/she leaves the Event.
- 5.6 Participation in the Event is at the Participant's own risk. The Participant irrevocably agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and reimburse Threshold from and for any sum, costs or expenses (including legal and professional fees) incurred, payable or paid by Threshold to any person (including the Participant and/or any of the Participant's insurers) in connection with any accident, loss, damage or injury (including death) arising out of the Participant's attendance at and participation in the Event or any part thereof (except where any such injury or death is caused by the negligence of Threshold or any of its employees).
- 5.7 The Participant confirms without reservation that he/she is in a good physical condition to participate in the Event, that he/she understands the endurance demands of the Event, and will not arrive at the Event in ill health or unfit to take part.
- 5.8 The Participant confirms that he/she will not publish or post on any website or other media operated by Threshold or related to the Event any text, statement, photograph, image or other material which is obscene, blasphemous, defamatory, infringes the intellectual property or other legal rights of any third party or is otherwise unlawful, offensive or inappropriate. Threshold will have the right to remove any material at its discretion and take appropriate legal action against any person found to be or alleged to be in breach of this Clause 5.8.
- 5.9 The Participant's journeys to and from the start and finish lines of the Event each day shall be entirely at the Participant's own risk and cost. Threshold will not be responsible for transporting the Participant or any belongings of the Participant, including, but not limited to, their bag.

6 PRIVACY STATEMENT

- 6.1 You are strongly encouraged to carefully review our Cookie and Privacy Policy in order that you familiarize yourself with the full details governing the collection, management, use and safeguarding of your personal data, which will supplement the provisions set out herein. - 6.2 The Participant agrees and consents to Threshold using his/her personal details provided in his/her Online Registration Form and Online Confirmation for the following purposes:

- As the Event organiser, Threshold requires a record of your registration details including third party emergency contact details for internal administration purposes in order to properly conduct and to safely administer the Event.
- Threshold will also keep records of medical information provided that it is kept confidential and may be shared only with medical personnel or teams allocated to the Event. This data will be shared securely. Such information shall be deleted within a reasonable time following the completion of the Event unless you agree that we may use such information in your entry for future Threshold events which are staged within a reasonable timeframe thereafter.
- All data will be held for three (3) years, unless requested otherwise, after which it will be safely and securely deleted permanently.

Digital communications

- Threshold will use the Participant's contact data submitted on the Online Registration Form to send the Participant information via social media networks, e-mail and/or by SMS relating to the Event, other Threshold events and any further categories of news and promotional information as the Participant may have requested on the Online Registration Form.
- The Participant acknowledges and agrees that Threshold may send additional notifications following the Event inviting the Participant to submit or renew his/her registration for any future Threshold events.

Active Networks

- Your personal details are processed on behalf of Threshold Sport by Active Networks LLC in the USA safely and securely. Active are registered under the USA Safe Harbor regime and by completing the Online Registration Form you agree to your details being processed this way.
- You are required to sign up to a waiver provided by our US database providers, Active Network LLC (the "Active Waiver"). Some of the provisions of that waiver may not be consistent with these Terms and Conditions and participants should note the following, which will override the terms of the Active Waiver:
 - To the extent that the Active Waiver may exclude or limit the liability of Threshold itself (or any of its sub-contractors or representatives) to participants, it shall not be effective. Other provisions within this document that relate to Threshold's liability (if any) shall be unaffected.
 - To the extent that the Active Waiver provides that you shall indemnify Threshold, it shall not be effective. Only indemnities (if any) set out in this document shall be effective.
 - Contrary to the terms of the Active Waiver, Active Network LLC will have no right to record your voice or photograph you in conjunction with the event in question. Any right that Threshold may have shall be in accordance with these Terms and Conditions.

6.3 The Participant agrees to inform Threshold of any changes to the information supplied in their original Online Registration Form for the purposes of Clause 5.1 above and particularly any changes to the Participant's medical condition and contact details.
